Position Title: Post-Graduate Fellowships in University Mental Health

Institution: Emory University

Department: Counseling & Psychological Services

Position Description: Emory University Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS) is pleased to announce two twelve-month, full-time Postdoctoral Fellowship positions and one twelve-month, full-time Post-MSW Fellowship position. Each Fellow has the opportunity to enhance and deepen his or her skills in brief and longer-term psychotherapy, crisis intervention, diagnostic interviewing, teaching, group therapy, outreach and consultation. Fellows at the Emory CAPS receive intensive, supportive training, which is designed to prepare Fellows for the diversity of roles which psychologists and social workers assume in their career paths. It is expected that Post-Graduate Fellows will work with a variety of clients, cultural backgrounds, presenting problems and treatment modalities. In addition, each Fellow has the opportunity to work with an identified Specialty Supervisor in order to focus his or her training on a particular area of clinical interest.

Qualifications: The 2000 hour Postdoctoral Fellowship meets or exceeds all requirements for psychology licensure in the State of Georgia, including a minimum of 500 direct service hours and a minimum of 2 hours per week of individual supervision with a licensed psychologist. Applicants for the Postdoctoral Fellowship should have graduated from an APA-accredited Clinical Psychology or Counseling Psychology doctoral program before the start of the Fellowship. Applicants whose transcript does not indicate that the doctoral degree has been conferred by their university by the application deadline should provide documentation from their graduate faculty that all requirements for the doctorate, including coursework, the dissertation and the doctoral internship, are expected to be completed by the August 1st start date.

The Post-MSW Fellowship provides weekly individual clinical supervision which meets requirements towards independent licensure as a Clinical Social Worker in the State of Georgia. Applicants whose transcript does not indicate that the MSW degree has been conferred by their university by the application deadline should provide documentation from their graduate faculty that all requirements for the degree, including coursework, the thesis and all clinical internships, are expected to be completed

by the August 1st start date.

Selections for the Fellowships are made without discrimination based on race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, gender, gender identity, age, disability, sexual/affectational orientation, or veteran's status.

Fellows receive the same health and dental insurance benefits as regular, full-time staff, and have access to University library and computer facilities. There is a fitness center on campus which Fellows may use for a low annual fee. Fellows receive twelve days of paid vacation, eleven University holidays, up to 12 sick days, a \$400 professional development fund (to assist with conference/workshop attendance costs), and one week of professional or educational leave.

Institution Description: Emory is among the top 20 universities in the country and is internationally recognized for its academics, groundbreaking research and technological advances with staff, faculty and students representing all regions of the United States and more than 100 foreign nations.

Region Description: Located just 15 minutes from downtown Atlanta, Georgia, in the tree-lined suburban neighborhood of Druid Hills, Emory University is positioned along the Clifton Corridor, which also includes the U.S. Centers for Disease Control.
