Psychologist and Outreach Events Coordinator

Strong presentation skills, ability to build relationships on campus, and attention to detail are a must. Experience and passion for working with diverse populations is highly valued.

In addition, we are seeking a strong generalist to provide initial assessment; individual and group counseling/therapy; crisis intervention; consultation; outreach and psycho-educational programming; and supervision of doctoral interns, clinical graduate assistants and practicum counselors. We are seeking a professional who is committed to the work of university counseling centers and who wishes to join a dynamic staff seeking ways to better meet the mental health needs of a campus population. The successful candidate will value a multifaceted approach involving strongly linked clinical and training efforts, consultation with the campus, mental health prevention/early intervention, multicultural values/awareness and collaborative campus connections. The Counseling Center serves a growing multicultural/international population on campus. Counseling Center staff

members do not have after hours on-call responsibilities. Minimum Qualifications

A doctorate in counseling psychology or clinical psychology is required, and it must be completed by the date of hire. Licensure in Missouri as a Psychologist is expected within six months of hire in the case of licensure already held in another jurisdiction. If circumstances differ, licensure time will be negotiated.

Desired Qualifications

A doctorate in counseling or clinical psychology from an APA accredited program with completion of an APA accredited internship is preferred. This is a generalist position; however significant experience with campus outreach is required. In addition to qualifications listed for the coordinator role, desirable skills include interest and experience in utilizing a brief therapy model, group therapy, expertise in multicultural counseling, crisis intervention, hospitalization experience and work with more complex cases. College or university counseling center experience is strongly desired.
