Supervise clinical work of post-doctoral fellows, interns, and practicum students. Provide outreach to student, faculty, staff, and university groups. Network and make referrals to outside resources when appropriate. Devise and conduct research projects and utilize findings to formulate or change center or university programs as directed by the service director. Perform other duties as assigned.
